Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

EVERYTHING IS CHANGED

Easter changes everything. Having been raised from the dead, Jesus shatters the frightful images that haunt humanity. Betrayal, torture, crucifixion, death, burial—these terrors pale in the brilliant glory of Jesus resurrected. Today's psalm guides our response to God's power: "it is wonderful in our eyes." Today is indeed a day for wonder, for gasping in astonishment at Jesus' resurrection. For all of human history, death had been final. In the Acts of the Apostles, though, Peter testifies that Jesus, who was publicly executed, was raised to life by God. John's Gospel admits that the disciples "did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." Even Jesus' closest friends were not expecting this innovation: life after death. In response to the Easter miracle, Paul tells us to become "a fresh batch of dough." Everything, even our very selves, must become new. Easter changes everything. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

The Resurrection, in all its glory and mystery, was not just one event among many in history; it was the event. Death was overcome and humanity was freed from its captivity to sin and the evil one. Imagine if you were a Roman soldier tasked with investigating the mysterious disappearance of a man who had been killed just three days earlier, a fact witnessed by hundreds of people. The 2016 film "Risen" approaches the Resurrection from this very angle, as a soldier named Clavius is sent by Pontius Pilate to get to the bottom of rumors that a Jewish messiah was raised from the dead and are spreading like fire throughout the region. What Clavius discovers changes him forever, as it should for all who encounter the risen Christ. This is a good one to watch during the Easter octave. Truly, he is risen!

A Ppaschal Myster Reflection







A Small Group Reflection on the Paschal Mystery

The seasons of Lent and Easter are times to reflect on the Paschal Mystery.

The word "Paschal" comes from the Hebrew word meaning "Passover". The sacrifice of the blood of the lamb smeared on the doorposts in the time of the Passover led to the deliverance of the Jews from Egyptian captivity. For us Christians, the Paschal Mystery refers to the Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

"By calling Christ's saving work the Paschal Mystery, we are reminded that it has been revealed by God (not by human beings) and that, although we can know a great deal about it, we will not fully understand the Paschal Mystery in this earthly life." (The Paschal Mystery, Saint Mary's Press).

But what does it mean for us?

During a zoom session of the small group, Divine Mercy/Marian group, the participants reflected on the Cross.

For them, the Cross is death and reminds us of the torture and suffering of Jesus, but... the Cross is also life, in that Jesus conquered death in His Resurrection and promised us eternal life. Thus, the Cross is hope in our being united with Jesus in both our earthly and eternal life. In turn, we trust in the Promise of the Cross and remain steadfast in faith.

In the Paschal mystery, we experience both sadness (in the suffering and death of Jesus) and joy (in His Resurrection) almost simultaneously. And that's a mystery.
