# Pastor's Column

### Around the Parish...

At the recommendation of Sr. Brendan Parish leadership, I wanted to present a preliminary outline of significant Parish projects, most notably St. Brendan School Seismic Retrofit. In 2014, the City and County of San Francisco upgraded standards for private schools with the intent to be the survivability of students and faculty and staff. By the time specific instructions were issued by The City and thence the Archdiocese, a year had passed. The originating legislation essentially called for a mandatory analysis of all schools needing repair/strengthening to evaluate the scope of repairs. This was called "Phase One" and was done for every private school in the City of San Francisco. St. Brendan's School was found to need structural strengthening to comply with the improved safety guidelines.

Luckily, Parish Leadership under Fr. Roger Gustafson, my predecessor, completed "Phase Two", and hired engineers vetted by the Real Property Support Corporation, ("RPSC"), and completed this next phase which estimated the cost of repairs in 2015 dollars at nearly \$3.5 million. Parish leadership and Fr. Roger elected to reduce this estimate by learning from other parish seismic upgrade projects. This was the situation as I arrived on 7/2/20. Luckily, with the help of the "RPSC", this project, which contained significant incentives if completed within 10 years from the enabling legislation, was begun last academic year. The more extensive testing of the building and the experience of the "RPSC", resulted in some vendor changes without sacrificing quality and we anticipate completion of the project by the conclusion of this summer of 2022! The estimated cost went down and is now closer to \$2.3million!

We have been working with both the Archdiocese and St. Brendan's School and our school community may have noticed that we are ending school at an adjusted schedule, (already communicated to parents), to keep scheduled overtime down.



When we reopen in Fall of 2022, we will have a safe facility for present and future generations of St. Brendan School children and faculty and staff.

We need volunteers/donors to help us replenish reserves that are being spent on this project. I am counting on the St. Brendan spirit to help us in this endeavor which will be announced in coming weeks.

#### WE ARE KNOWN BY OUR FRUIT

This week, Jesus tells us that we must examine our own inner selves, our attitudes and dispositions, virtues and faults, rather than judging others. What is in our hearts comes out in what and how we speak. The Wisdom writer Sirach in the first reading agrees with this concept—that we will be judged by our words. Paul reminds us that the reward of discipleship is eternal life. Today's psalm of thanksgiving and praise reminds us of God's kindness and faithfulness, which we are to emulate in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are known, each of us, by our own fruit.







For much of my life, I didn't look forward to Lent, and only focused on giving something up. Well, that's a start, and I still do, but that's not the only thing I think about.


